The van Savelsteyn Connection

If one looks at the van Alderwerelt genealogy, the 1751 marriage of Joan Carel van Alderwerelt and Alida Anna de Roo seems to be routine with nothing out of the ordinary.

What the normal genealogy presentation does not show, however, is that Joan Carel van Alderwerelt's mother, Tanneken Carels van Savelsteyn, and Alida Anna de Roo's grandmother, Anna Carels van Savelsteyn, were half sisters. The father of the two girls is listed in the VOC archives as Carel Jan Carelsz. It appears that he dropped the van Savelsteyn name, as he is generally mentioned without it. All references to his daughters appear with the van Savelsteyn name added again.

The abbreviation VOC stands for the Dutch United East India Company, founded in 1602, which was a trading company operating extensively throughout the Far East, not only in the Dutch East Indies, now called Indonesia, but also in India, Siam, Ceylon, Persia, Formosa and Japan.

The history of the van Savelsteyn name is lost in the past. The girls' grandfather, Jan (or Johan) Carel van Savelsteyn is said to have been born in France, and it is unlikely that he had the van Savelsteyn name at birth. It is more likely that he assumed this name when he came to Holland or when he went to work for the VOC.

So did Willem de Roo and Rogier van Alderwerelt, both married to van Savelsteyn girls, know each other? The answer is no. Willem de Roo died in Batavia in 1712, while Rogier van Alderwerelt did not sail from Amsterdam to the Dutch East Indies until 1714.

Joan Carel de Roo, son of Willem de Roo, held many important functions in Delft, including that of Mayor. He was married to Sara Harpentina van Kinschot, a descendant of the Dutch naval hero Admiral Tromp.

Joan Carel van Alderwerelt, son of Rogier van Alderwerelt, also became an important member of the establishment after marrying Alida Anna de Roo. He became Mayor of Delft and held many other high offices.
